
We are writing to inform you that the Select Committee on Ethics (the Committee) dismissed a complaint filed against you by Representative Anna Paulina Luna. Specifically, the complaint alleged campaign finance violations and inappropriate conduct of a sexual nature. In response to your request for an investigation, the Committee referred these allegations to you and requested additional information on April 17 and May 15, 2026. Based on the investigation of the Committee, the Committee did not find evidence that your actions violated Federal law, Senate Rules, or related standards of conduct.

In reaching this determination, the Committee considered information provided in the complaint; statements offered by individuals identified in the complaint; Federal Election Commission reports; the Expenditure Report of the Secretary of the Senate for 2025; Expenditure Reports of the Clerk of the House of Representatives; House of Representatives reports of privately sponsored travel; and the information you provided in your responses to the Committee's requests. The Committee also noted your prompt contact with the Committee following media reports of the allegations and appreciated your full cooperation with the Committee throughout the investigation. As always, the Committee retains the authority to revisit this matter should additional facts become known to the Committee.


The Committee is charged with the difficult task of ensuring that all Senators uphold the institutional standards of the U.S. Senate. This is a responsibility that is both broader than and distinct from mere enforcement of express prohibitions codified in Federal law and the Senate Rules. Pursuant to the Committee's authorizing resolution, Senate Resolution 338 (1964), the Committee is charged with investigating all "improper conduct that may reflect upon the Senate." Accordingly, each Senator is expected to display the highest standard of integrity and demonstrate personal behavior beyond reproach to avoid any discredit on the institution of the Senate.
